1. Department of Education Update Regarding the Ukraine Crisis

Sincere thanks to all schools which have completed the capacity survey issued by the Department just prior to Easter. It is very beneficial in planning for the potential school placement of students displaced because of the crisis in Ukraine.

Where schools have the capacity to enroll students arriving from the Ukraine they are asked to do so and at the earliest opportunity to record their attendance on P.Pod. One of the challenges being experienced in schools in some areas is the temporary nature of placements. This is related to the availability of secure medium to long term accommodation for students and their families. It has been reported by the Department that EAL allocation applications are being processed quickly for schools.

Where schools do not have capacity to accept students from Ukraine they are asked to provide the contact details of the local REALT team and assist students and their families contacting the services available through the REALT team.

Access to school transport has been a challenge in a limited number of areas. Bus Eireann is coordinating the provision of school transport. Schools are advised not to engage in potentially expensive local solutions with private contractors and instead report any issues to the local REALT team.

While the numbers arriving on a weekly basis appear to have slowed slightly, somewhere less than 60% of children of school going age have enrolled in schools. In some cases, students are accessing educational supports online including supports from Ukraine. The Department are seeking any information from schools where students have requested support from Ukrainian students seeking access to the Ukrainian equivalent of our Leaving Certificate.

The work schools and communities are engaged in responding to this latest crisis and supporting Ukrainian students and their families is immense and greatly appreciated.

- a. The School-based Summer Programme (see below) offers an opportunity for schools to address the needs of migrant students such as addressing English language skills and integration, including students who have recently arrived in Ireland from the Ukraine. Where schools see a need for English language supports for post-primary students enrolled on these programmes, they will be able to avail of ESOL tutors via the Regional Education and Language Teams. The NCSE provides resources to support the school-based summer programme. The resources support tutors to provide fun and engaging learning experiences for students that focus on consolidating relationships with their schools, supporting physical, social and emotional well-being, developing resilience, building their confidence as learners and developing skills and routines to support successful transition into the next stage of their schooling. - b. The Teaching Council has developed a tailored registration process to support
 the registration of qualified Ukrainian teachers who have been granted Temporary
 Protection under the EU Temporary Protection Directive. The two below links

To date, the Council has received approximately 70 queries and five applications from Ukrainian nationals who may meet the eligibility requirements for qualified teachers wishing to register in Ireland. Supporting the Safe Provision of Schools (2020-22), in its conclusion, the report highlights that the collaborative nature of the development of the SSPS inspection model ensured that school communities and education partners were fully involved in the development of the inspection framework. This was a key factor in the successful implementation of the SSPS model.

The Inspectorate's monitoring of anti-bullying measures as set out in the Procedures published in 2013 in schools in the September-November 2021. Overall, the findings of this report are broadly positive. The report confirms the extensive work being undertaken by many principals, teachers, other staff, parents and students to raise awareness of and prevent school bullying. The report illustrates how schools, in the main, are both mindful of and alert to the breadth of their responsibilities for the social, emotional and behavioural support of children and young people.

Schools should ensure that the anti-bullying prevention and intervention strategies in place are regularly reviewed and monitored for effectiveness and impact. The Department of Education has commenced a review of the 2013 procedures.

4. "Belong To" Supports for Schools

Belong To is delighted to launch a **new evidence-based LGBTQ+ Quality Mark** designed to support and accredit **LGBTQ+ Safe and Supportive Schools**.

The LGBTQ+ Quality Mark is a whole school approach which focuses on the four key areas of wellbeing promotion from an LGBTQ+ perspective:

- Creating an LGBTQ+ culture and environment
- Resourcing an LGBTQ+ inclusive curriculum
- Nurturing LGBTQ+ inclusive relationships and partnerships
- Supporting LGBTQ+ inclusive policies and planning

Belong To will provide supports and training to schools embarking on and engaged in this journey of inclusion and participation in 2022/23 which is strictly limited to 35 schools in 2022.
