# Escalating reports to TikTok

We want to share important information about how schools, the National Association of Principals and Deputy Principals (NAPD) and the Association of Community and Comprehensive Schools (ACCS) are collaborating to strengthen online safety.

NAPD and ACCS can report accounts to TikTok which may violate its <u>Community Guidelines</u> on a school's behalf. In the first instance, please report the account in-app or through the online reporting form. Instructions on how to report in-app are available <u>here</u> and the link to the online form is available <u>here</u>.
